Grade 3 and 4 Writing

Grades - 3, 4

Have you ever wondered about the far off land of Egypt or wanted to meet someone famous like Bill Gates? TA's Grade 3 & 4 Writing course takes students through a journey on the topics of countries and people! To build a strong writing foundation, students will explore fascinating topics and practice paraphrasing, summarizing, structuring paragraphs, contrasting, note taking, editing, and timed writing. Outside of this highly interactive course, students will be asked to complete around 1 hour of homework per session.

Grade 3 and 4 Math

Grades - 3, 4

How can you plan a budget and schedule for the vacation of your dreams? TA's Grade 3 & 4 Math course can help! Through projects, games, worksheets, and challenges, students practice grade-level-appropriate multiplication, division, fractions, decimals. Additionally, given student performance, this course can cover special topics such as time, measurement, and money. Outside of this highly interactive course, students will be asked to complete around 1 hour of homework per session.

Grade 3 and 4 Reading

Grades - 3, 4

Have you read about the American revolution, automobiles, giant panda bears, or ancient languages? TA's Grade 3 & 4 Reading course explores engaging topics that challenge students to read broadly! To build a strong reading foundation, students will read dramatically, discuss topics with peers, write responses to passages, and take comprehension quizzes. Outside of this highly interactive course, students will be asked to complete around 1 hour of homework per session.

Grade 5 and 6 Writing

Grades - 5, 6

The Grade 5 & 6 Writing course improves students' narrative writing. Classes will teach how to produce well-developed characters, consistent story arcs, and vivid descriptions. Students will model from examples, brainstorm, produce drafts and learn how to proofread and edit their work. By the end of the program, students will have written their own narrative. Students are expected to complete around 1 hour of homework per session.

Grade 5 and 6 Math

Grades - 5, 6

Our Grade 5 & 6 Math course teaches students the understanding and capability needed to deal with fractions, decimals, and unit conversion: essential skills on the road to middle school. Students train through drills and activities, applying their understanding across a range of problem types. Students are expected to complete around 1 hour of homework per session.

Grade 5 and 6 Reading

Grades - 5, 6

The Grade 5 & 6 Reading course teaches students to respond to texts and their peers. It focuses on discussion, considered responses, critical questioning, debate, analysis, and presentation. Students are expected to complete around 1 hour of homework per day. As a long project, each student will also need to read and present on a biography of his or her selection.

Elementary School Classes

Grade 3, 4, 5 Vocabulary Seminar - (CLOSED)

Grades - 3, 4, and 5

Students in this class will learn 20-30 words per session, following the Elementary Vocabulary Cartoons book. The goal is to make words such as "aqueduct," "prance," and "encroach" eventually become not only part of their daily conversation, but also part of their writing assignments. Each class period introduces 20-30 words, and concludes with a 20-minute quiz to ensure students retain all their newfound vocabulary knowledge. Each class will include a range of activities designed to improve retention. (NOTE - Students are provided a copy of the book.)

A. FREE Class Audit

IMPORTANT NOTES

A. Class Cancellation

For dates when students cannot come to the class, students/parents can notify us more than 24 hours to avoid being charged.

- Cancellations (attendance notice) that are made within 24 hours of the scheduled session will be charged as a regular attended session.
- Students who fail to notify any TA staff of their absence will be charged for the missed session (No-show charge)

B. Class Redundancies

Classes that run on multiple days within the week cover the same content. To avoid covering the same lesson content, please sign up for only one of these classes.

C. Class Billing

- Classes are now billed at the end of the month
- Students are billed only for the sessions which they register for and don't cancel
- Audits are free of charge and are only billed once the student decides to join the course

Registration Policy:

- 1. Students can join classes after the start date (EXCEPT for SAT classes).
- 2. To join or audit a class, students **MUST** register.
- 3. Registration must be done within a minimum of 24 hours before the class you would like to attend.
